Foxborough Residents and Businesses,

On May 14th of this year, Chris Gallagher, Town Engineer, and Tim Thompson, Traffic Engineer with Pare Corporation, appeared before the Board of Selectmen (BOS) to discuss the current traffic pattern around the Common, and to propose a temporary traffic control plan to test out possible improvements. At that meeting, the BOS asked Mr. Gallagher to perform additional analyses and to publicly release the plan, once available, for comment prior to again appearing before the BOS. At this time, the only change proposed for testing this fall is at the northerly end of the Common, involving Main Street and Rockhill Street. The plan involves extending the traffic island located at the northerly end of the Common into the outer lane around the Common at Main Street, which would result in those driving in the outer lane of the rotary (after they pass Bird Street) to exit onto Main Street. To continue around the rotary, a driver would need to be in the inside lane.

The temporary block would be a set of traffic drums that would restrict travel past Main Street to the inner lane only. Due to this temporary block, Rockhill would have to be one way toward the Common.

Other Notes:

- If approved, the temporary traffic control plan test period would begin October 21, 2019 and end November 15, 2019.
- The proposed plan does not affect parking spaces around the Common.
- Prior plans discussed making Bird Street one-way, however this has been reevaluated and Bird Street is now proposed to remain two-way at this time.
